- Two #2 pencils
- Kneaded Eraser (This is a grey, square flat eraser used for watercolor paper) No regular erasers please.
- **Brushes:** #4, #8 and #12 round, 1 inch flat, 2 inch wash brush for wetting skies and water, #4 script for branches and wispy grasses and twigs.
- Paper: 140 lb. Watercolor paper 11x15 inches. A board to tape your paper so that it does not buckle...
  - O An alternative to sheet paper is a watercolor block which acts as its own board. When the painting is finished you simply remove the top sheet with an x-acto knife.
- 1 inch masking tape (not blue tape)
- Two plastic containers for water absolutely necessary.
- Ruler
- Paper towels Very important in watercolor. Also keep a hair dryer handy.
- Watercolor palette: A covered palette is good to store paints.
- **Watercolor paint:** Winsor Newton Cotman or Grumbacher Academy (Reasonably priced student grade is good for beginners).
  - o Cadmium Red or any bright red suitable for a barn (i.e. Winsor Red, Naphthol Red)
  - o Burnt Sienna
  - o Cobalt Blue
  - o Raw Sienna
  - o Mauve or Dioxazine Violet
  - o Van Dyke Brown
  - o Sepia
  - Daniel Smith Moonglow is nice for shadows
  - o Payne's Grey or Indigo or any dark color for windows
  - White gouache or Titanium white acrylic
- Graphite transfer paper (optional) this is needed to transfer a tracing on to watercolor paper when we do use a tracing. Another option is tape the tracing to a window put your watercolor paper over the tracing and just draw the old fashioned way.
- Removable Liquid Mask: In order to preserve some white on the roof top and some branches masking fluid is helpful though not necessary. The white can be done with a bit of white acrylic or gouache. A demonstration on the use of the mask will be done in class.
- **Drawing** should be done prior to class so that you can be ready to paint.
