Library Director Peter Abramov passed away on July 22, 2021 at his home in Georgetown, Texas. Peter Abramov, III was born February 21, 1940, in New York City. A lifetime library user, Peter secured a library card application at the age of 7 and brought it home for his mother's signature. He took that love of libraries and made a lifetime as a patron, reference librarian, library director, and volunteer. Peter became the Library Director of Sayville Library in 1970 and held that position for 27 years. We extend our deepest condolences to his friends and family.

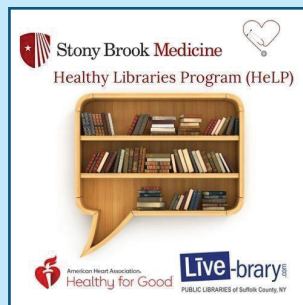
NEW! S.M.A.R.T. Recovery Group coming soon, watch our calendar and webpage for dates and times!
